After each reading, your student will take comprehension and critical thinking assessments. After they complete the first two pieces, students will learn how to write a nonfiction narrative. They will then write a nonfiction narrative answer the question: What event changed your understanding of yourself, or that of someone you know? Your student will also write a piece comparing the traditions of one culture to another.
