Comprehension Strategy: Question—ask questions about what you are reading

Writing Focus: Informative writing—instructions (in a letter)

Activities to Do Together

Vocabulary

Ask your child to choose an animal, and then create questions about the animal using this week's **Words to Know.** Together, look for answers to your child's questions.

It's a Mystery

Talk about something in nature that seems like a mystery, for instance, why the moon changes shape from night to night. Together, make up a fictional tale that explains the mystery.

That's a Fact

After creating a tale to explain a natural mystery, work together to find out about the science behind the mystery. Then have your child write a few sentences to explain the mystery scientifically.
